



## **EJC-KPF FELLOWSHIP PROGRAMME**

### **Korea, 24 August- 5 September 2010**

The European Journalism Centre (EJC) is an independent, international, non-profit institute dedicated to the highest standards in journalism, primarily through the further training of journalists and media professionals. Building on its extensive international network, the Centre operates as a facilitator and partner in a wide variety of training and research projects.

Korea Press Foundation (KPF) is an independent, non-profit organisation dedicated to promoting professional journalism in Korea. KPF leads seminars, training courses and research programmes for journalists. It also organises journalist exchanges, fellowship programmes and international conferences.

The KPF-EJC Fellowship Programme is carried out by these two independent organisations to meet the above objectives.

#### **1. Qualifications and Selection**

The European Journalism Centre is responsible for the pre-selection and recommendation of the 6 European Fellows. Applicants for the programme should have at least five years' experience as full-time professional journalists. They must have a good command of English listening, speaking and writing, as all the lectures will be conducted in English. The programme is designed to provide a comprehensive understanding of Korea.

#### **2. Programme**

The duration of the programme in Korea is 10 days. This programme will consist of lectures, meetings and interviews covering politics, economy, society and culture. A group-tour will follow and will last about three to five days, during which, various social and cultural activities will be planned. The main objective of the programme is to promote better understanding of Korea in general.



### 3. Financing

The programme provides European Fellows with a payment equal to 500 euros to partially cover flight tickets. Accommodation, local transport, interpretation and subsistence fees will be paid by the organisers. Reference materials will also be provided. The fellows are requested to pay their personal expenses.

### 5. Application Procedure

The European Journalism Centre (EJC) will pre-select and recommend four Fellows. Therefore, applicants have to apply on-line directly to the EJC's website specially created for the Fellowship <https://ejcnet.wufoo.com/forms/ejc-kpf/> by the 4<sup>th</sup> of July. Print journalists or editors affiliated with newspapers or news agencies are encouraged to apply, though people from broadcasters are not excluded. Full-time employees of media organisations are given priority over free-lancers.

Deadline for the applications is the 4<sup>th</sup> of July 2010. After this date, any application will not be taken into consideration.
